



HERRING POPULATIONS IN TROUBLE

Impacts of Dams on Rivers • Block fish passage

HOT DIGGETY DAM!

- Warm temperatures
- Trap sediment and nutrients
- Degrade water quality





DER AND WATERSHED RIVER RESTORATION PROJECTS

Includes flow restoration, dam removal, tide gate and culverts

22 dam removals opened 16 miles of river

9 dams under consideration 112 dams remain

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- Dam and Seawall Repair and Removal Funding Increase or maintain funding
- Division of Ecological Restoration (Line-Item 2300-0101) Increase or maintain funding (Governor's budget cuts budget by \$90,000)
- Reinstate matching cash funding for the Massachusetts Bays National Estuary Program \$600,000 annual grant to the state from this program.
